## Réamhrá

Rinne an Ciste Náisiúnta um Cheannach Cóireála (CNCC) dul chun cinn arís in 2009. I gcaitheamh na bliana rinneadh tuilleadh dul chun cinn maidir leis na hothair ab fhaide a bhí ag fanacht le gnáthaimh mháinliachta, rinneamar cóireáil ar an 150,000<sup>th</sup> othar le linn 2009 agus chonaiceamar go ndearnadh níos mó dul chun cinn maidir le luach níos fhearr ar airgead a bhaint amach.

## 2009

Tá áthas orm a thuairisciú gur chabhraigh an CNCC le beagnach 29,000 othar poiblí anuraidh trí chóireáil níos tapa a sholáthar dóibh. Bhíofhas in ann an raon iomlán de mháinliacht a sholáthar gan é a bheith riachtanach aon othar a chur lasmuigh d'Éirinn. Ina theannta sin tugadh sainordú don CNCC caibidlí a dhéanamh maidir leis na praghsanna a iocfaidh an Stát as cúram fadtéarmach do dhaoine scóthaosta faoin Scéim um Thacaiocht Tithe Banaltrais. Trí scéim a thugtar "Cothrom na Féinne" uirthi, rinneadh caibidlí le 440 teach altranais priobháideacha ionas go bhféadfaí an scéim a thosú ar 27<sup>th</sup> Deireadh Fómhair, 2009.

## Daoine ag Fanacht le Fada

I rith 2009 thug Bord agus bainistíocht an CNCC fúthu cóireáil a dhéanamh ar na daoine ab fhaide a bhí ag fanacht ar liostaí feithimh máinliachta. Ag deireadh 2007, bhí 4,637 othar ag fanacht le máinliacht le breis is dhá mhí déag agus ag deireadh 2008 ní raibh ach 1,576 acu ann. Ag deireadh 2009 ba é 719 an figiúr, agus léirigh sé sin méadú ón bhfigiúr ab ísle riamh mar a bhí 477 othar ag deireadh Mhí na Samhna, 2009.

Léiríonn gnáth-iniúchadh ar shonraí faoi liostaí feithimh gurb amhlaidh maidir le 60% den chohort reatha a thuairiscitear gurb iad siúd is faide atá ag fanacht nach bhfuil siad ag fanacht go gníomhach le cóireáil. Tugann sé sin le tuiscint nach mór go mbeadh an riarrachán/bainistíocht bhunúsach ar liostaí níos láidre i roinnt ospidéil. Dóibh siúd atá ag fanacht go gníomhach ardaitear an cheist cén fáth nach féidir cabhrú le líon beag othar, nach ionann ach 0.1% dóibh siúd a cóireáladh.

## Luach ar Airgead

Tuigeann an Bord na dualgais atá air maidir le luach ar airgead a fháil. Maidir leis an CNCC ciallaíonn sé dá ísle an praghas gur mó othar ar féidir iad a chóireáil. Agus cúram ospidéil á sholáthar tá dualgas breise ar an CNCC luach ar airgead a sholáthar gan cailíocht ná caighdeán a laghdú. Le teacht chun cinn na n-ospidéil priobháideach nua le blianta beaga anuas osclaíodh an margadh do cheannaitheoirí agus

## Introduction

2009 was another year of progress for the National Treatment Purchase Fund (NTPF). It was a year that produced further results in relation to those patients waiting longest for surgical procedures, it was during 2009 that we treated our 150,000<sup>th</sup> patient and it was the year that witnessed more inroads being made in achieving greater value for money.

## 2009

I am pleased to report that the NTPF facilitated almost 29,000 public patients last year by providing them with faster treatment. It was possible to provide the full range of surgery without the need to send any of these patients outside Ireland. In addition, the NTPF was mandated to negotiate prices which the State will pay for long term elderly care under the Nursing Homes Support Scheme. Known as the "Fair Deal" scheme, negotiations were completed with 440 private nursing homes so that a start-up date of 27<sup>th</sup> October, 2009 was achieved.

## Long Waiters

The Board and management of the NTPF set out to treat the longest waiters on surgical waiting lists during 2009. At end 2007, there were 4,637 patients waiting for surgery for over twelve months while at the end of 2008 the comparable figure was 1,576. At end 2009 this figure was 719, which was up from an all time low of 477 patients at end November, 2009. Routine audit of waiting list data shows that at least 60% of the current cohort reported as waiting longest are actually not actively waiting for treatment. This suggests that basic administration/housekeeping of lists needs to be more robust in some hospitals. For those who are actively waiting it begs the question why a small number of patients, representing less than 0.1% of those treated cannot be accommodated.

## Value for Money

The Board is conscious of its obligations in securing value for money. For the NTPF it also means that the lower the price the more patients that can be treated. In the provision of hospital care there is an added onus on the NTPF to provide value for money without compromising on quality and standards. The advent of new private hospitals in recent years has opened the market for purchasers and has enabled more

Leanfaimid orainn ag scrídú bealaí chun an leas is fearr a bhaint as cistí na gcáiníocóirí a chuirtear ar fáil dúinn. Tá luach ar airgead mar chuspóir lárnach againn freisin inár gcuid caibidil le tithe altranais príobháideacha faoin scéim um thacaíocht tithe banaltrais. Ní gá a rá freisin gurb amhlaidh dá mhó luach ar airgead a bhaintear amach in earnáil na dtithe altranais, is é is mó áiteanna ar féidir iad a mhaoiniú faoi Cothrom na Féinne agus is é is tapa a mbeifear in ann daoine nach dteastaíonn géarchúram uathu a thuilleadh a scaoileadh ón ospidéil chuig áit níos oriúnaí.

### Rochtain na nOthar Seachtrach

Is ceann de na baic reatha inár gcóras ospidéil é rochtain ar chomhairleoirí d'othair phoiblí a fhreastalaíonn ar chlinicí othar seachtrach dá gcomhairliúchán tosaigh agus ar go leor bealaí cuireann sé i gcuimhne na fadhbanna a bhí ann maidir le máinliacht roghnach d'othair chónaitheacha nuair a bunaíodh an CNCC ar dtús. Cé nach raibh mórán rannpháirteachais againn sa réimse sin, le linn na tréimhse ó 2005 go 2009, rinneadh teagmháil le breis is 82,000 othar tríd an CNCC agus táirgeadh coinní dó i gclinicí othar seachtrach. Is mian liom go mbeadh rochtain níos fearr ag othair phoiblí ar chlinicí othar seachtrach agus táim cinnte gur féidir i bhfad níos mó dul chun cinn a bhaint amach sa réimse seo.

### Conclúid

Cé go raibh go leor dúshlán ag baint leis an mbliain 2009, is féidir dul chun cinn an-mhaith a thuairisciú. Mar fhocal scoir ba mhaith liom buíochas a ghabháil leis an Aire as a tacálocht i gcónaí. Ba mhaith liom buíochas a ghabháil leis an Roinn Sláinte & Leanaí as a cúnamh. Sa deireadh ba mhaith liom a rá le Bord an CNCC gur thaitin sé go mór liom oibriú libh agus gabhaim buíochas le foireann an CNCC.

competition to operate together with a calmer environment in which to negotiate procedure prices. It is also no secret that as the funding allocated to the NTPF has grown, so too has its ability to seek greater savings from hospitals through greater volume discount purchasing and further income opportunities for the private sector. Ninety-five percent of NTPF funding is expended on direct patient care and we are anxious that this ratio is maintained and improved upon if possible. We will continue to look at ways of getting the most from the taxpayer funds made available to us. Value for money is also one of our core objectives in our negotiations with private nursing homes under the nursing homes support scheme. It goes without saying that the more value obtained in the nursing homes sector, the more places can be funded under the Fair Deal and the quicker persons who no longer require acute care can be discharged from our hospitals into a more appropriate setting.

### Out-Patient Access

Access for public patients to consultants at out-patient clinics for their initial consultation is one of the current bottlenecks in our hospital system and in many ways mirrors the issues in elective in-patient surgery when the NTPF was first established. While our involvement in this area has been limited, over the years 2005 to 2009, more than 82,000 patients have been contacted via the NTPF and offered appointments at out-patient clinics. I would like to see improved access for public patients to out-patient clinics and I am sure much more can be achieved in this area.

### Conclusion

While 2009 was a challenging year in many ways, much progress can be reported. In concluding I would like to thank the Minister for her continued support. I would like to acknowledge the assistance provided by the Department of Health & Children. Finally to the Board of the NTPF, it has been a pleasure to work with you and to the staff of the NTPF, thank you.

### Othair

I rith 2009, mar a bhí amhlaidh gach bliain, díriodh obair an CNCC ar rochtain ar chóireáil a fheabhsú do na hothair phoiblí is faide atá ag fanacht. Tá sé mar aidhm againn rochtain a sholáthar ar chúram ardchaighdeáin a bhíonn inghlactha d'othair agus a léiríonn luach maith ar airgead. D'inis na hothair dúinn arís eile in 2009 go raibh siad an-sásta leis an gcóireáil a táirgeadh dóibh faoin tionscnamh seo.

### Tréimhse Feithimh

Áitíonn an CNCC i gcónaí nach é an lín daoine atá ag fanacht ach an tréimhse ama a bhíonn siad ag fanacht atá ríthábhachtach. Is é an fáth ar bunaíodh an CNCC ná chun an tréimhse feithimh a ghiorrú d'othair phoiblí agus rochtain níos tapa ar mháinliacht a fháil dóibh. Tá áthas orm a rá go raibh an mheántréimhse feithimh d'othair mhíochaine agus mháinliachta in Éirinn laghdaithe go dtí dhá mhí go leith faoi dheireadh 2009.

### Gníomhaíocht

Baineadh amach na spriocanna gníomhaíochta do 2009 a aontaiodh maidir le gnáthaimh othar cónaitheach, comhairliúcháin othar seachtrach agus tástálacha raideolaiochta agus tá siad leagtha amach sa rannóg staitisticí den tuarascáil seo. Cuirteadh an oiread sin éileamh breise ar an CNCC i rith na bliana nach rabhthas in ann freastal orthu go léir. Is léir go bhféadfá déileáil le níos mó cásanna dá mbeadh an maoiniú ar fáil. Ní rabhthas in ann é sin a dhéanamh, áfach, agus mar chomhartha de na cúinsí atá i réim i láthair na huaire, níorbh mhór gníomhaíocht a ghiorrú níos mó mar gheall ar laghdú 10% ar an mbuiséad a fuarthas.

### Cothrom na Féinne

In 2009 tugadh freagráchtai nua don CNCC faoi Alt 40 den Acht fán Scéim um Thacaíocht Tithe Banaltrais, 2009, ar a dtugtar "Cothrom na Féinne" freisin. Tugtar sainordú don CNCC chun caibidí a dhéanamh maidir leis na praghanna a focfaidh an Stát as tithe altranais priobháideacha maidir le cúram fadtéarmach do dhaoine scothaosta. Ag druidim leis an lá tosach feidhme, bhain an CNCC comhaontuithe aonair amach le tuairim is 400 teach altranais priobháideacha. Bhí sé riachtanach freisin dúshlán i gcoinne amlínte beartaithe an CNCC a chosaint san Ard-Chúirt. Tá caibidliú praghanna leis na tithe altranais priobháideacha mar chuid leanúnach de shainchúram an CNCC anois.

### Patients

Throughout 2009 as with every other year, the focus of the work of the NTPF has been improving access to treatment for public patients who have been waiting longest. We aim to provide access to high quality care that patients find acceptable and that represents good value for money. Patients have told us again in 2009 that they are very satisfied with the treatment offered to them under this initiative.

### Waiting Time

The NTPF has always maintained that it is not the number of people waiting but the length of time they have to wait, that is the critical factor. The reason the NTPF was established was to shorten the waiting time for public patients and to secure for them quicker access to surgery. I am pleased to say that at end 2009 the median waiting time in Ireland for medical and surgical patients was down to two and a half months.

### Activity

2009 activity targets agreed for in-patient procedures, out-patient consultations and radiology tests were achieved and are set out in the statistics section of this report. Extra demands placed on the NTPF during the year were such that it was not possible to meet all of them. It is no secret that more cases could have been facilitated if funding permitted. However, this was not possible and as a sign of the times we live in, activity had to be trimmed back further to the 10% reduction in the budget received.

### Fair Deal

In 2009 the NTPF received new responsibilities under Section 40 of the Nursing Homes Support Scheme Act, 2009, otherwise known as "Fair Deal". The NTPF is mandated to negotiate prices which the State will pay private nursing homes in respect of long term elderly care. In the lead up to the commencement day, the NTPF concluded individual agreements with approximately 440 private nursing homes. It was also necessary to defend a challenge to proposed NTPF timelines in the High Court. The negotiation of prices with the private nursing homes is now an ongoing part of the NTPF remit.



## An Beartas um Bainistiú Liostáí Feithimh

I Nollaig 2009 seoladh beartas náisiúnta nua chun bainistiocht a dhéanamh ar liostáí feithimh d'othair chónaitheacha agus othair lae in ospidéil phoiblí, ag tacú leis an an gClár do Chóireáill Othar. Forbraíodh an beartas sin chun go mbeifí in ann bainistiocht chomhsheasmhach a dhéanamh ar shonraí na liostaí feithimh d'othair chónaitheacha, chásanna lae máinliachtá agus míochaine i gcóras na n-ospidéal poiblí. Forbraíodh an beartas i gcompháirt le Feidhmeannacht na Seirbhise Sláinte agus leis an Roinn Sláinte & Leanaí. Is é an t-ospidéal aonair atá freagrach as an mbeartas a chur i bhfeidhm agus as a chuid liostaí feithimh a bhainistiú dá réir.

## An Athbhliain 2010

I measc na bpriomhspriocanna atá againn le haghaidh 2010 tá leibhéal ard sástachta othar a bhaint amach, leanúint orainn ag fáil cóireála níos tapa d'othair agus caighdeáin ardcháillíochta cúram a choimeád d'othair an CNCC. In 2009 dhírigh muid den chuid is mó ar na daoine ab fhaide a bhí ag fanacht, i.e. na hothair siúd a bhí ag fanacht le máinliacht ar liostaí feithimh na n-othar cónaitheach le breis is dhá mhí déag. Baineadh amach dul chun cinn an-mhaith sa réimse sin i gcompháirt leis na hospidéil phoiblí. Tá sé in am dúinn bogadh ar aghaidh agus an bhacainn maidir leis na daoine is faide atá ag fanacht a íslíú níos mó. Le staid reatha an gheilleagair tá sé níos tábhactai fós leanúint orainn ag iarraidh luach níos fearr ar airgead a bhaint amach. Mar sin ní mór dúinn níos mó gníomhafochta a fháil leis an maoiniú a chuirtear ar fáil agus caighdeán an chúram achoimeád ag an am céanna. Tá sé beartaithe againn cabhrú le 30,000 othar in 2010. Arís ba mhaith liom buíochas a ghabháil le pearsanra idirchaidrimh an CNCC sna hospidéil éagsúla ar fud na tíre agus aitheantas a thabhairt don tsárobair a dhéanann siad ar mhaithe le cúram othar. Ba mhaith liom mo buíochas a chur in iúl do Bhord an CNCC as a gcúnamh agus a dtreoir le linn 2009. Freisin is mian liom obair fhoireann an CNCC a aithint.

## Waiting List Management Policy

In December 2009 a new national policy for the management of in-patient and day case waiting lists in public hospitals, supporting the Patient Treatment Register was launched. This policy was developed to enable consistent management of in-patient, day case surgical and medical waiting list data in the public hospital system. The policy was developed in conjunction with the Health Service Executive and the Department of Health & Children. It is the responsibility of each individual hospital to implement this policy and to manage its waiting lists accordingly.

## New Year 2010

Among our primary targets for 2010 are to continue to achieve a high level of patient satisfaction, to continue to get patients treated more quickly and to maintain high quality standards of care for NTPF patients. In 2009 a lot of our time was focused on the longest waiters, i.e. those patients waiting more than twelve months on in-patient waiting lists for surgery. In co-operation with public hospitals much was achieved in this area. It is time to move on and to lower the barrier further in relation to the longest waiters. In the current economic climate it is even more important to continue to strive for greater value for money. We therefore need to obtain more activity for the funding provided while at the same time not compromising on the quality of care. In 2010 we propose to facilitate 30,000 patients. Once again I would like to thank all the NTPF liaison personnel in the various hospitals around the country and acknowledge the good work they do in the interests of patient care. I would like to say thank you to the Board of the NTPF for their assistance and guidance during 2009. I also wish to acknowledge the work of the staff of the NTPF.

While the targets set throughout 2009 in terms of patient care were met there are a number of items that merit specific mention:

- In August 2009 the NTPF facilitated the treatment of its 150,000th patient, Mr John Keegan, from the Midlands who had been waiting 6 months for a urology procedure. Mr Keegan kindly agreed to speak with the media in order to highlight the NTPF option to the public. By the end of 2009 almost 165,000 patients have had access to faster treatment via the NTPF.
- The Patient Care and Finance teams further developed processes to continually achieve value for money while ensuring quality of care.
- Internal team re-organisation was undertaken in order to maintain and deliver a consistent level of service within the current staff complement. The positivity of team members in this is acknowledged.













#### Age Profile of In - Patients Treated in 2009 Total = 19,857









Charlotte had been on the waiting list at Sligo General Hospital for a knee procedure for 14 months when she contacted the NTPF Lo-call line. Charlotte was referred to St Joseph's Hospital, Garden Hill and was treated within a short number of weeks. Charlotte is now pain free and through physiotherapy treatment, will return to full mobility.

*"I was in terrible pain, particularly when driving. It was just wear and tear of the knee joint but it was getting worse by the day. 



#### Introduction

The National Patient Treatment Register (PTR) is a register of all patients on in-patient and day case waiting lists in Ireland. The register collects, collates and presents information received directly from hospitals electronically. Waiting times are published monthly on the PTR website which can be accessed on [www.ptr.ie](http://www.ptr.ie). The NTPF also publishes detailed analysis on waiting lists twice yearly through its National Patient Treatment Register Report.

#### National Policy for the Management of In-Patient and Day-Case Waiting List Data

Launched by the Minister for Health and Children on 4<sup>th</sup> December 2009, the National Policy for Management of In-patient and Day Case Waiting List Data is a manual of agreed definitions and standards for the management of in-patient waiting list data. This new policy has been agreed by hospitals, the National Hospitals' Office, the HSE and is endorsed by the Department of Health and Children. It replaces the July 2007 Guidelines. The PTR team run a training and development programme on the new policy and this is available to all hospitals.

#### Accurate and Consistent Reporting

The Review and Analysis program reviews the accuracy of data presented to the Patient Treatment Register and the adherence of hospitals to the national policy on the management of waiting list data.



In 2009 scrúdaíodh sampla de bhrefis is 6,000 de na daoine ab fhaide a bhí ag fanacht. Seo a leanas na torthaí:-

- Bhí 33% ag fanacht le cóireáil lena n-áirítear othair a tuairiscíodh, mar thoradh ar chastacht chliniciúil, nach raibh siad oiriúnach d'atreorú agus iad siúd a dhiúltaigh do thairiscint maidir le cóireáil an CNCC.
- Ní raibh 29% ag fanacht le cóireáil agus bhí siad curtha i gcatagóir nua i.e. na hothair siúd nár cheart a bheith ar liosta feithimh mar go raibh cóireáil faighe acu cheana féin nó go raibh siad mí-oiriúnach do chóireáil.

In 2009 a sample of over 6,000 of the longest waiters was examined. The results were as follows :-

- 38% - were awaiting administrative follow up i.e. the patient had not responded to correspondence from the hospital or had not attended a scheduled appointment.
- 33% - were awaiting treatment including patients who were reported, because of clinical complexity, as being unsuitable for referral and those who had declined an offer of NTPF treatment.
- 29% - were not awaiting treatment and were re-categorized i.e. these patients should not have been listed as waiting as they had either had treatment or were currently unsuitable for treatment.





### Cóireáil a Cheannach ó Ospidéil

- Tá luach ar airgead a bhaint amach fós mar chuspóir lárnoch don CNCC. In 2009 leanamar orainn ag obair le ospidéil phríobháideacha chun an lín othar ar féidir iad a chóireáil a uasmhéadú. Má tá na praghnsanna áirithe um chóireáil a tháirgeann ospidéil don CNCC níos airde ná an ráta margaídh aimseomíd soláthraí malartach. Ciallaonn sé sin go gcuirtear othair an CNCC chuig soláthraithe ardchaighdeáin a thugann luach níos fíorr ar airgead sa chás ina luíonn sé le réasún é a dhéanamh.
- Tagann toradh dearfach breise as an bpriónsabal simplí “leanann lín luach” mar féadann ospidéil phríobháideacha pleanál a dhéanamh ionas go dtiocfaidh laghdú ar phraghsanna na cóireála de réir mar a thiocfaidh méadú ar lín ná n-atreoruithe údaraithe othar ón CNCC.
- Ciallaonn sé sin go bhféadann an CNCC margáil lascaine as lín a chaibidliú agus leanúint air ag déanamh giarála ar éifeacht na méaduithe ar áiteanna d’othair mar thoradh ar ospidéil phríobháideacha agus clíní nua in Éirinn. Chonaiceamar tionchar an chur chuíge sin nuair a tháinig laghdú 15% ó 2006 ar an meánchostas iomlán as othair chónaithe agus othair lae. Is ionann é sin agus cogilteas an-mhór nuair a mheastar go raibh boilsciú miochaine ag dul i míid thar an tréimhse chéanna agus nach bhfuil athrú tagtha ar ár bpróifil cásanna.
- Is gné an-tábhachtach freisin í tagarmharcáil maidir le cinntíú go bhfaighimid luach ar airgead. Cuirtear na praghnsanna a tháirgeann ospidéil faoi roinnt tástálacha lena n-áirítear comparáid i gcoinne praghnsanna as cóireáil chosúil in ospidéil phríobháideacha eile, agus i gcoinne praghnsanna a focann árachóirí miochaine, nuair a chuirtear ar fáil go poiblí iad. Freisin cuirtear praghnsanna i gcomparáid le meánchostais na n-ospidéil poiblí (“sonraí cásmeascáin”).
- I rith 2009 rinne Oifig an Ard-Reachtaire Cuntas & Ciste athbhreithniú fairsing trí mhíosa ar an CNCC a chuimsigh seiceáil neamhspleáach ar na socruite chun cóireáil a fháil ar bhealach costéifeachtach. Tháinig a athbhreithniú ar an gconclúid go raibh costas an chuid is mó de ghnáthaimh a cheannaíonn an CNCC ó ospidéil phríobháideacha níos lú ná an costas comparáideacha tagarmharcála poiblí.

### Purchasing Treatment from Hospitals

- Achieving value for money remains a key objective for the NTPF. In 2009 we continued to work with private hospitals to maximise the volume of patients that could be treated. If particular treatment prices offered to the NTPF by a hospital are higher than the market rate we will source an alternative supplier. This means that when and where it makes sense to do so NTPF patients are steered to quality providers that represent better value for money.
- This simple principle of “volume follows value” has an additional positive consequence because private hospitals can plan in a way that the treatment price lowers as the volume of NTPF authorised patient referrals increase.
- This means the NTPF can both negotiate volume discount deals and continue to leverage the effect of increases in capacity due to newer private hospitals and clinics in Ireland. We have seen the impact of this approach with a 15% reduction in the overall inpatient and day-case average cost since 2006. At a time when medical inflation over the same period was increasing and our case profile remained broadly unchanged, this represents a very real saving.
- Benchmarking is also an important ingredient in making sure we get value for money. Prices offered by hospitals are subjected to a number of tests including comparison against prices for similar treatments in other peer private hospitals and, when publicly available, prices paid by medical insurers. Prices are also compared with public hospital average costs (“casemix data”).
- During 2009 the Office of the Comptroller & Auditor General conducted an extensive three month review of NTPF that included an independent check on arrangements for the cost effective procurement of treatments. His review concluded that most procedures purchased by NTPF from private hospitals cost less than the comparable public benchmark cost.



## Praghsanna a Aontú le Tithe Altranais

### Príobháideacha

An 3 Iúil 2009 thug an tAire Sláinte & Leanaí feidhm d'ailt 40 & 41 den Acht fán Scéim um Thacafocht Tithe Banaltrais 2009. Chuir sé sin ar chumas an CNCC, de réir an dlí, praghsanna a chaibidiú agus a aontú le húníréí tithe altranais príobháideacha agus deonacha chun críocha na scéime nua um thacafocht tithe banaltrais ("Cothrom na Féinne")

Tá sainchúram sonrach ag an CNCC laistigh den scéim sin a riarrann FSS. Má chreideann an CNCC go dtugann na praghsanna a tháirgeann teach altranais luach ar airgead tagtar ar chomhaontú praghsála leis an teach altranais agus soláthraímid faoi seach na sonraí ábhartha faoi phraghsáil do FSS.

Thángthas ar chomhaontuithe maidir le praghsanna le beagnach gach teach altranais príobháideach sa tir sular tugadh feidhm don scéim an 27 Deireadh Fómhair 2009.

Agus é seo á scríobh, tá 440 (99%) teach altranais príobháideacha agus deonacha tar éis praghsanna a aontú leis an CNCC. Táimid cinnte freisin gur féidir comparáid fhabhrach a dhéanamh idir na rátaí agus na meánmhéideanna a d'foc cónaitheoirí agus teaghlaigh sular tugadh feidhm don scéim.

### Costais Riaracháin a Bhainistiú

Tá costais riaracháin an CNCC fós réasúnta íseal agus iad ag 5% d'ioncam deontais. Coimeádadh na costais iomlána riaracháin le haghaidh 2009 ar leibhéal 2008 cé gur tabhaíodh costais bhreise mar thoradh ar ról nua an CNCC le tithe altranais.

### Ag Breathnú ar 2010

Ag cur leis an dul chun cinn a rinneadh go dtí seo, táimid ag tnúth le hoibriú le hospidéil agus tithe altranais agus muid ag leanúint orainn ag baint amach luach níos fearr ar airgead agus cúram ardchaighdeáin.

## Agreeing Prices with Private Nursing Homes

On the 3rd July 2009 the Minister for Health & Children commenced sections 40 & 41 of the Nursing Homes Support Scheme Act 2009. This legally enabled the NTPF to negotiate and agree prices with private and voluntary nursing home owners for the purposes of the new nursing homes support scheme ("Fair Deal").

The NTPF has a specific remit within this, HSE - administered scheme. If the NTPF are of the view that prices offered by a nursing home represent value for money a pricing agreement is reached with the nursing home and in turn we provide the HSE with the relevant pricing details.

Agreements were reached on prices with almost all private nursing homes in the country before the commencement of the scheme on 27th October 2009.

At the time of writing 440 (99%) private and voluntary nursing homes have agreed prices with the NTPF. We Are also satisfied that the rates agreed compare favourably with the average amounts paid by residents and families prior to the commencement of the scheme.

### Managing Administration Expenses

The NTPF's administration expenses remain relatively low at 5% of grant income. Total administration expenses for 2009 have also been maintained at 2008 levels even though additional costs were incurred as a result of NTPF's new role with nursing homes.

### Looking Forward to 2010

Building on progress so far, we are looking forward to working with hospitals and nursing homes in continuing to achieve further value for money and quality care.

## Opportunities exist for nursing homes despite downturn

**By John Hughes**  
THE current economic climate remains challenging but can act as an opportunity rather than an adverse effect on other parts of the market.

The voluntary and community nursing homes owners are demonstrating resilience on fees and occupancy levels, new regulations impacting on public and private facilities impacting on the level of availability of bank funding.

With a changing profile to the demographics of the Irish population it is expected that there will be more people who will be over 65 years and increase significantly over the next 15 years. Those people in the category of over 65 is expected to be approximately 800,000 by 2024. Since 1997 there

are three standard whilst older homes have six years to comply with the existing regulations. The effect of this will be that older homes in the private sector will be required to contribute due to capital expenditure required. The Government have also published a proposal to restructure the method by which they will reward nursing homes.

Xenon in "The Deal" the new system will require nursing home residents to pay 80% of their weekly dispensing income towards the cost of long term care with the state making up the difference. In return the state will be permitted to claim up to 15% of the residents private residence — equivalent to the fees.



n-oibríocht nó gnáthamh SAOR in aisce.

Ní chuirfidh sé isteach ar bhealach ar bith ar  
a dteidlíochtaí maidir le cártaí Leighis agus  
cabhraíonn an CNCC le hothair a theastaíonn  
ídír mórghnáthaimh agus miónghnáthaimh  
uathu.

As a result of the NTPF **164,449** patients  
(December 2009) have been treated and
